U.S.-Iran Conflict: Strategic Context

- U.S.-Iran conflict since 1979
- * Reagan to Obama (1981-2017):
 - * Each U.S. Administration tried to define the conflict in limited political, diplomatic, & covert operations
- Differing views of Iran:
 - * The U.S.
 - Israel



U.S.-Iran Conflict: Strategic Context

- * Iran and U.S. "red lines"
 - * Trump breaks the "red line" understating
 - Shocks Tehran leadership
- * Threats to Iran: Internal & external
- Shift of proxy wars, political information/influence operations
- Iranian miscalculation regarding U.S. "red line"



The Operation to Execute Soleimani

- * April 2019: Trump signs the authorization
- * U.S. did not seek escalation with Iran. Did not respond to:
 - Japanese oil tanker attack
 - Downing of U.S. drone
 - Saudi oil facilities attack
- National security team & intelligence community: pulled together operational details of Soleimani's plan



Who Was Soleimani?

- Second most powerful man in Iran
- Ran Iran's proxy, paramilitary, political intelligence, & diplomatic operations
 - Proxy infrastructure to alter geopolitical balance of power
- Built the Hezbollah apparatus: Syria, Lebanon, Iraq, Yemen, etc.
- * Objective: U.S. out of Iraq & Middle East



Origins of International Law

- European intellectual thought
 - Sir Thomas More, Hugo Grotius: Is it legal to kill an enemy anywhere during wartime?
 - St. Augustine: "Just war" doctrine
- U.S. Founding Fathers
 - * Jefferson: uncivilized abuses
- * 20th century: Assassination as a tool of statecraft
- * Since 2001: U.S. & Israel increase lethal covert operations



Case Study: Admiral Yamamoto

- * 1943: U.S. Navy intercepts ADM Yamamoto's itinerary
- * Aim to restore morale after Guadalcanal
- * U.S. seminal operations:
 - April 1942: Doolittle Raid
 - June 1942: Battle of Midway
 - April 1943: Operation Vengeance



A New Middle East/Persian Gulf

- Regional realignments
 - * U.S.-Israel
 - * U.S.-Israel-Saudi Arabia
 - * MESA/GCC
 - * China-Russia-Iran
