- Diseases caused by poor hygiene (infection, malnutrition)

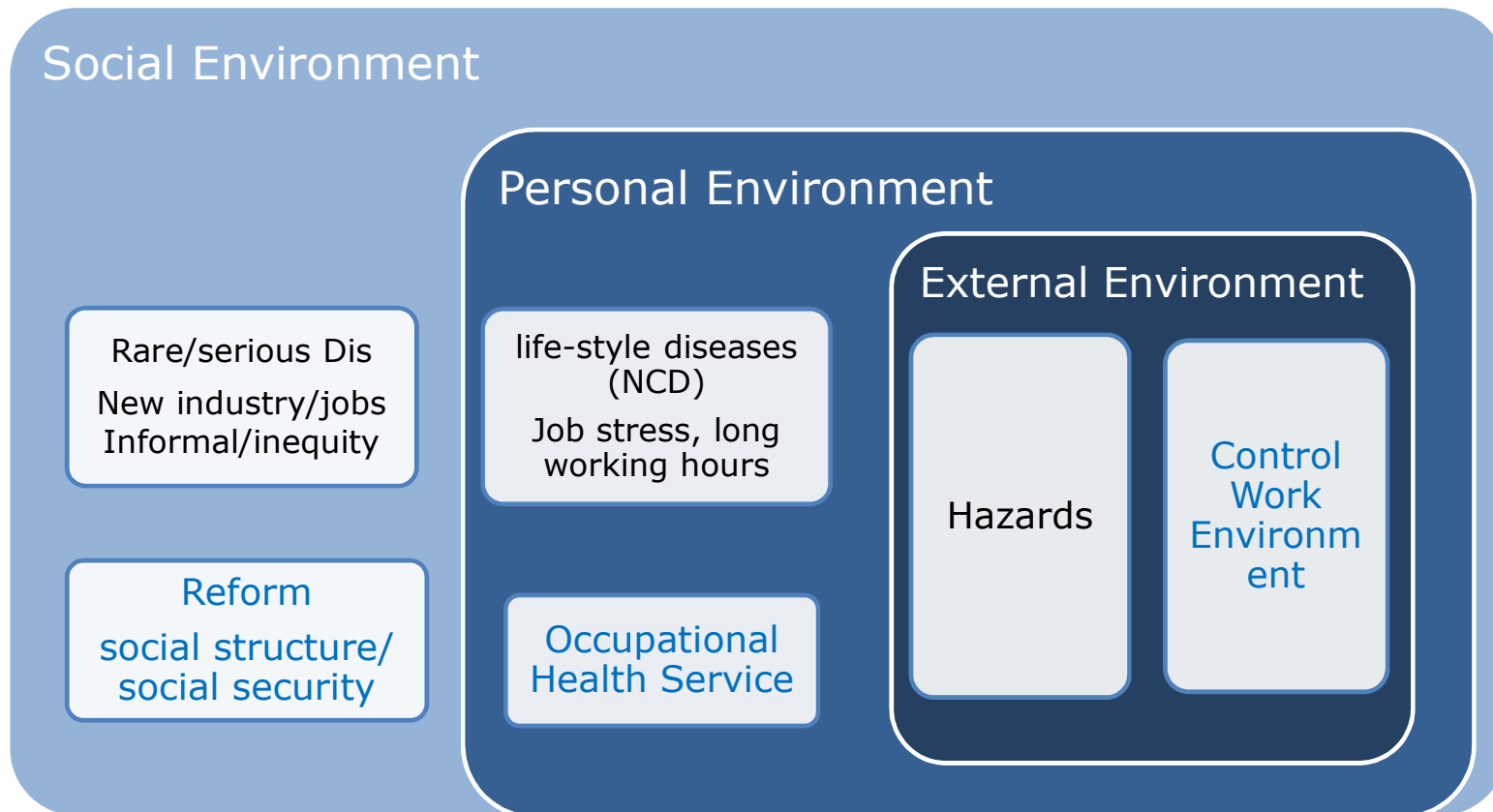
Incomplete
