Evolving Role of Labour Inspection

- Shift from enforcement to fosterin prevention culture
- Balance between compliance chec and catalysing change
- Labour inspectors as agents of change, educators, and partners







Reimagining Labour Inspection

- Balance enforcement with engagement and support
- Provide guidance for effective safety management systems
- Promote proactive risk assessment
- Encourage worker participation
- Utilise data and technology for targeted efforts
